Welcome to 6WB Parents and Caregivers

Welcome to Term 2. It's great to see everyone back and eager to learn. After a disrupted start to Term 1 for myself personally, it is great to be back into the swing of it for Term 2. It was also fantastic to meet all the parents we have in 6WB during information sessions, phone calls and parent teacher interviews. I am not surprised we have such a respectful and upbeat group after meeting you all. We have well and truly established our routine and have a lot of learning planned for the coming weeks. Paul Kelly Cup, PSSA winter sport, oral presentations and the Multicultural Perspectives Public Speaking Competition, The Premier's Spelling Bee, and zone carnivals are just a few of the exciting activities students may have the opportunity to participate in.

Curriculum

In **English** this term we will focus on Oral language and communication, Vocabulary, Reading comprehension, Creating written text, Spelling, Handwriting and digital transcription, and Understanding and responding to literature. Our goal is to develop students who are independent, can read for sustained periods and write more complex texts. An oral presentation task has been sent home and students will be presenting these in Week 4.

In **mathematics** this term, Stage 3 students will continue to learn in their maths groups for the number strand. Teachers meet regularly to discuss assessment results and student progress. From these discussions, movement in math classes is made for each topic. Mrs Gigengack and Miss Wearne's maths groups are participating in a Maths Olympiad this term. Students remain in their home class for measurement.

In **science and technology**, students will be going to Mr Neil's room in the Manor building. Students will study the Material World. This strand focuses on how the properties of a range of materials and the way in which they are combined, determine their use and inform design solutions. Students investigate the different properties of solids, liquids and gases, and consider combining and separating mixtures. Stage 3 of this strand introduces students to fundamental concepts of chemistry and is an introduction to materials technologies.

In **history,** we will continue to investigate how key figures and events shaped the development of Australian democracy and explore how Australian society has changed throughout the twentieth century.

In **creative arts** this term, Stage 3 will investigate the representation of the face and human figure in masks, sculptures, drawings, and multi-media art. They will consider how realistic representation, exaggeration and distortion of features and forms creates expression that has meaning for an audience.

In **music and dance** with Mrs Morris, Stage 3 will use a variety of instruments, such as glockenspiel, djembe, recorder, ukulele and voice, to perform in ensemble. They will use their knowledge of notation on the treble clef, along with note values, familiar and less common time signatures to sight-read to play familiar instruments or sing using traditional black and white notation. Stage 3 will also begin work to link their understanding of rhythm, tempo and other musical concepts to choreograph and perform creative and expressive movement in response to a variety of music stimuli.

Home-learning- It is recommended that students read for 20 minutes each day and practise their times tables. Students will also have an oral presentation that is due in Week 4.
