Welcome back to Term 3, 2024.

I hope you have all had a lovely break and spent some time with your family. Please find below, an overview of what to expect for the term. This will differ from class to class. If you have any questions, please contact the school to arrange for a phone call or meeting with your child's classroom teacher. This term we have some exciting things happening including school camps, Paul Kelly Cup, Netball Schools Competition and the 'Dancing through the Decades' performance. PSSA will continue, with the last day of competition being Friday 23 August (week 5).

This term's learning will focus on:

In **English** this term we will focus on Oral language and communication, Vocabulary, Reading comprehension, Creating written text, Spelling, Handwriting and digital transcription, and Understanding and responding to literature. We are continuing our study on Authority and Argument using our mentor text Eureka Boys. We will then focus on the English concepts of imagery, symbol and connotation.

Students will continue with **number groups** this term. Number groups are taught on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. **Number groups** will continue to be dynamic and flexible. Students will be assessed and then grouped regularly to ensure students are being catered for at their point of need. Measurement will be delivered and taught by the classroom teacher.

In **science and technology**, students will be going to Mr Neil's room in the Manor building. This term, students will continue the study of Earth and Space. This strand focuses on Earth's place in the solar system, changes on its surface caused by natural disasters and the exploration of how these may be mitigated. In addition, this strand further develops students' understanding of the Earth, its position in the solar system and as a dynamic part of a complex, interrelated system.

We will continue learning about child protection and respectful relationships in **personal development and health** and exploring our values and feelings in SEL (social and emotional learning). Students will also be participating in growth and development lessons later in the term (a separate note will go home with more information).

In **physical education**, we will be focusing on heart health by participating in activities to help us stay fit and energetic, such as skipping and dancing.

This semester, in **geography**, students will explore countries of the Asia region and the connections Australia has with other countries across the world. Students will learn about the diversity of the world's people, including the Indigenous Peoples of other countries. Students will explore and reflect upon similarities, differences and the importance of intercultural understanding.

In **creative arts**, students will participate in drama activities where they will be experimenting with improvisation, role playing, character development and storytelling. We will also be practising and refining our dance routines for the 'Dancing through the Decades' performance. In **music** this term with Mrs Morris, Stage 3 will identify and

discuss structure, developing systems to record and reproduce their own musical compositions. We have an initial focus on drumming circles, using a repertoire of internalised chants and songs to ensure that rhythms are reproduced accurately in ensemble, while maintaining a steady tempo. Stage 3 will have opportunities to record their own ideas using a variety of digital and analogue techniques.

Home-learning - It is recommended that students read for 20 minutes each day. Students may also receive optional home learning tasks to complete throughout the term as well as activities on Google classroom.

Stage 3 teachers will continue to follow the assessment schedule to assess student learning across all areas of the curriculum. Our focus is to identify areas of proficiency and areas for improvement. Formative assessment results will continue to provide the basis for effective teaching across Stage 3 classrooms.

Public Education Week 2024 is in Week 3. The theme this year is 'Proud to Belong'. **Albury PS is celebrating Public Education Week with our Open day on Thursday 8 August.** We will commence at 10:00am with open classrooms, where you can visit your child's classroom and look at, and discuss, your child's learning with them. This is not an opportunity for parent/teacher interviews, which can be made for other mutually suitable times. A family picnic lunch will then follow from 11:00am – 11:45am with a sausage sizzle that is currently available for preorder only. Parent information session will then be run from 11:45am with our APC&Is to discuss how to support your child with literacy and numeracy. We hope to see you at the school on Thursday 8 August.
