A message from the Principal

Week 2 Term 1 2020

On Monday this week we welcomed our new Kindergarten students to Albury PS. As I walked around the school throughout the week, Kindergarten students were very settled and despite a few tears as the idea of coming to school every day gets a bit much towards the end of the first week, all students seemed happy and engaged in their new learning.

Kindergarten picnic Friday 7 February: As tomorrow, Friday, is the conclusion of our new Kindergarten students first whole week at school, parents/carers/grandparents are invited to join the Kindergarten students and their teachers for a picnic lunch. Lunch begins at 11:00am – 11:45am. If you are able to join us, please enter through the David Street gates and sign in before joining your child/ren.

Yesterday we were finally able to form our new classes for Years 1 - 6. Despite the large number of new enrolments in the first week we had a number of families who did not let us know that they were leaving and this meant that we had to restructure most of the classes on Thursday and Friday. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

As a result of the extreme weather last Friday's scheduled swimming carnival was postponed until Tuesday of this week. The weather was much kinder, even a bit cool for some of the early races but it was still a highly successful and well-run day. For those students who made it through to zone, the carnival will be held on Tuesday 25 February. Notes for the successful students will be sent home when this information is available.

During physical activities, including sport, students will be given the option to not participate if they feel the smoke haze is of concern to their health.
